Opening Films, Closing Film, First Program Highlights, Nightline & VoD-Collection

Onward Towards Europe!

In four weeks the **16**th **edition** of the CROSSING EUROPE film festival will take place in Linz from **April 25 to 30**. After months of intensive preparation, the entire film program for CROSSING EUROPE is now fixed, and will once again offer the audiences a cinematographic journey through Europe. Without giving too much away, the virtual trip through Europe will contain **around 150 feature films and documentaries**, from Iceland through **more than 40 countries** all across the continent to the Black Sea.

Thus the festival stays true to its creed and stands for a hand-picked film program that does justice to the variety of Europe and intends to show a differentiated way of looking at the European state of affairs — with cinephile positions that offer an image of Europe that is open to the world and looks toward the future, and intends to inspire to take a closer look at contemporary European cinema.

Before giving a compact preview of the coming festival edition, we want to call attention to the following dates and events relevant to the festival: both program press conferences will take place on Wednesday, April 10 – in Linz at 9:30 am (OÖ Presseclub) and in Vienna at 4 pm (Austrian Filmmuseum). One day later, April 11, the ticket sale will start (details HERE). As was the case last year, May 1 will be the unofficial audience day of the festival. From 2 pm onward the City-Kino in Linz will show award winners and audience favorites in the "Best-Of CROSSING EUROPE" program. Besides that, a number of festival cooperation partners will offer follow-up screenings outside of Linz: among others, the Programmkino Wels, the /slasheinhalb at the Filmcasino in Vienna, and for the first time the Votiv Kino where CROSSING EUROPE will be a quest on seven evenings in May.

Opening Films 2019

As is tradition, CROSSING EUROPE will open with **multiple films** this year that stand for the **great variety of contemporary European cinema**, and also offer a cross section of this year's program.

The openings on April 25 are spearheaded by the Berlinale award winner (SYSTEMSPRENGER), will show a radicalized Denmark shaken by dystopia and political unrest (DANMARKS SØNNER), will be dedicated to the Upper Austrian photographer Elfie Semotan (ELFIE SEMOTAN, PHOTOGRAPHER – Preview), and will show two women fighting for their right to their own story and personal good fortune (PETRA and BOTA). A number of guests have already announced their attendance – see film list below.

At an age of nine Benni has already experienced a lot. Her hyper-activity paired with a not so negligible propensity for violence hopelessly overburdens her mother, while constantly changing foster parents, child psychologists, and anti-aggression training does the rest. Despite eager social workers there is still the danger that Benni falls through the net of youth welfare. – Nora Fingscheidt's film debut is an intense drama about a girl who does not seem to fit into the system, yet only yearns – as would be expected at that age – for safety and love.



Subsequently she then also meets his wife, and their son – like in a Greek tragedy – she unveils family secrets, satisfies needs, and the web of relationships that underscores the film draws together in a deadly manner to make the newest production by this year's Tribute guest Jaime Rosales become a spirited Melodrama.

BOTA is the first feature film by this year's Spotlight guest Iris Elezi. The visually striking production celebrated its Austrian premiere at the CROSSING EUROPE 2015. - The terror of the communist regime in Albania continues to have an effect to date, people yearn for economic and political stability. As do the two sisters in the film, who take their fate into their own hands on a lonesome tract of land.

Closing Film: GOD EXISTS, HER NAME IS PETRUNYA

CROSSING EUROPE has been connected to the Macedonian director Teona Strugar Mitevska since the very beginning. At the very first edition of the festival in 2004, her feature film debut KAKO UBIV SVETEC / HOW I KILLED A SAINT (MZ/SI/FR 2004) was awarded the CROSSING EUROPE Award – Competition fiction. Ever since then, all her films have been presented in Linz as Austrian premiers. For this reason, we are very happy to announce that her new feature film, which had its world premiere at the Berlinale and was awarded with two awards (Prize of the Ecumenical Jury and the Gilde film prize) will be this year's closing film.


The film will be shown on April 30 in attendance of the director Teona Strugar Mitevska and the lead actress Zorica Nusheva.

First Program Highlights

In this year's program selection you will find many CROSSING EUROPE guests and award winners from the previous editions who will be returning to Linz with their current productions – significant films in this year's edition made by directors who have been connected to the festival for many years, thereby also shaping the festival.

Joanna Hogg (<u>Tribute guest</u> in 2014) puts the focus on a young, up-and-coming artist in **THE SOUVENIR**. Next to the shining Honor Swinton Byrne, Tom Burke and Tilda Swinton are also a part of the feature film that had its world premiere at Sundance and contains autobiographical streaks of Hogg herself.





In the center of the newest feature films by the Swiss director Simon Jaquemet (2015: <u>CHRIEG</u>) and the Greek Syllas Tzoumerkas (2015: <u>A BLAST</u>) are women on the brink. Jaquemet's protagonist in **DER UNSCHULDIGE** meanders through her day-to-day life characterized by religion, family, and trust in technology. A crime puts two women on the crossroads to the test in Tzoumerkas' **THE MIRACLE OF THE SARGASSO SEA**.

The YAAAS! Competition is a part of the new YAAAS! Youth Program at CROSSING EUROPE, that offers a holistic program of film education, acquisition of media competencies and DIY-video production.
